and understanding, do make this my last will and
Testament in manner and form following (that is to say)
I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved husband
William McNatt the whole of my Estate both real and
personal as well the property which I have and
possess under and by virtue of the Will of my deceased
brother Robert Osborne, as such other property or
estate as I have hold and enjoy by purchase or other
wise under the restrictions hereinafter mentioned
I give to my beloved niece Sarah Price Lewis a Negro
girl of the value of three hundred dollars to be
paid for her by my Executor, out of the monies
arising from such part of my estate as my said
Executor may think fit to sell, or from profits
of my estate if he think it best; but upon the
express condition and proviso, that my husband
William McNatt shall not be disturbed in the pos-
session of the property real and personal herein
before bequeathed to him, neither by the said Sarah
Price Lewis or any other person who may pretend
to claim the same or any part thereof as heir or
heirs of myself or my deceased brother Robert Osborne
And lastly I do hereby appoint my beloved husband
William McNatt sole executor of this my last will
and Testament hereby utterly revoking all wills here-
before by me made - In testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand this 4th February 1806.
