In the name of God Amen
I William Nasworthy of the County of Burke in the
State of Georgia being of sounde and disposing minde
and memory do hereby make, constitute and ordaine this
to be my last will and testament.

I desire and direct that all my lawfull debts be paid by
my executors hereinafter appointed.

^{1st} I give devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Nasworthy
^{2nd} the following property to wit All my Matthew Jones tract of
lands wherein I now live containing twelve hundred and fifty
acres more or less also that portion of the Lambert tract bearing
the above lands to the big or public Roads for and during her
natural life and at her death to go to and with absolutely nothing
left her Franklin Nasworthy and his heirs for ever in fee simple
^{3rd} I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Nasworthy the fol-
lowing negroes to wit Nancy and her four children Christian
Elijah June and Edmunds and their issue for and during
her natural life and at her death to go to and with absolutely
nothing left her George and Uriah Nasworthy each to have

and to sell or divide them as they may think proper

^{4th} I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Nasworthy the
following property to wit One half of all my Stock of all kinds
consisting of Cattle hogs Sheep horses and Mules and one half
of all my household and Kitchen furniture and half of all
the Cotton and provision crop on hand at the time of my death
after satisfying and paying such bequests as is herein after made
One horse Briggz and harness and the following negro to
wit George young Hammah Margaret Amos Warren Gatesy Mary
and her infant child unmarried, and their issue forever in fee simple

^{5th} I give devise and bequeath unto my nephew Franklin Nasworthy
the following property to wit my gold watch and chain my wagon
and harness and a one horse Briggz and harness and one half
of all my Stock of all kinds consisting of Cattle hogs Sheep
Horses and Mules and one half of all my household and Kitchen
furniture and one half of all my cotton and provision crop that
may be on hand at the time of my death after satisfying such
bequests as is herein after made and the following named
negroes Hammah known as Hammah Pierce and her child Thomas
a yellow boy Alec Moses Western Matthew Savannah Elizabeth
Doria John Lewis Lawson and Leah and their issue to him and
his heirs forever in fee simple.

^{6th} I give devise and bequeath unto my niece Rosetta Lewis the
following property to wit all of my Lambert tract of land not
herein otherwise disposed of lying on the other side the public
Road next to Allen Lawrence and the following negroes

to wit Maria Emily Casdall his annual and Staff and their future
in case to bid soldly in the said Rosetta for her sole and separate
use free from the debts contracted liabilities or encumbrances of her person
& or any future husband and after her death to her children or
grand child or grand children and provided further if the said Rose
tha should die and have no child or children or grand child or grand
children as contemplated by this clause of my will in such case
I desire that said land and Negroes and their issues be sold and
divided between the Children of my Brothers George and Uriah
Harrison each to share and share alike in the distribution of the
same and in case either of the Children of my Brothers should die
previous to the death of the said Rosetta and leave lawful issue
such child or children shall stand in the place and stead of
their deceased parent or parents being a child or children of the
said George or Uriah.

9th I give devise and bequeath to my Nephew Wiley Harrison
Negro man Cook and his heirs for ever in fee simple
8th I desire and direct that the following named negroes be sold with
all their increase Henderson, Holaday, Sillar and his wife Francis
Henry and Mandy and the proceeds of the sale be divided between
my nieces and nephews to wit Uriah Harrison's children and
Delia Hasty Jane Bap James Woodard Wiley Harrison George
Harrison, Tom and William Scammons each to share and share
alike in the distribution of the same.

9th I desire my Negro woman Burke Co. GA wills 1835-1858

sold to such person as she may
select for her master at such price as the appraisers of my other
property may put upon her and the proceeds of sale paid
over to the trustees of Bark Camp Church for the use of said
Church and should she not bring five hundred dollars
I desire that that sum shall be raised from such other
property as my executors may deem proper and paid
over to the trustees of said Church as aforesaid before any
other of my property be distributed as directed in this my will
I desire that my remains be buried at Bark Camp Church and
that my grave be walled in with brick ten by thirty feet and done
and direct that such sum as may be required to pay for the same
be taken from my Estate before a division of the same be made
and for any of my friends to be buried therein that may desire
it especially Rebecca Crisp.

11th I give devise and bequeath unto my respected friend Rebecca
Crisp the following property to wit all that tract or parcel of
land known as the George T. Crisp land and one other tract
known as the Paul place in the whole containing six hundred
and forty acres more or less also the following named negroes
to wit Amy and her three children Maria, Ned and an infant
name unknown and their increase for ever.

12th And lastly I hereby appoint and constitute my Nephew Franklin
Harrison and my trusty friend Franklin Jones Executrix of
this my last will and testament hereby revoking and an-
nulling all other heretofore made by me and of left you
and confirming this to be my only true and last will

Instrument. On which whereof I the said William
Wesworth have therewith set my hand and seal this
13th day of September A.D. 1854.

testament in my presence and in the presence of another

Codicil

- Parag 1st Item 3rd I William Wesworth of the State and County aforesaid
desire that this Codicil be appended to my will dated Sept
ember 13th 1854 revoking such items or parts of items as may
appear to me necessary and proper, also I wish to devise
certain other property which I have acquired since the
original Will was made; my will of September 13th 1854,
I wish to be held valid in all its parts with the exceptions
hereinafter made in this Codicil
- Item 1st I give to my beloved wife Sarah, Solomon a negro man
slave in fee simple forever.
- Item 2nd I leave to my beloved wife Sarah, during her natural life,
Adam a negro man slave, Antony a negro man slave, Abram
a boy slave, nearly grown, Leah a negro woman slave and
her infant, not yet named, Burke Co. GA Wills 1854-1858
www.georgiapioneers.com a negro girl slave
nearly grown during her natural life and at her death to be
as directed, Antony and Adam to my brother George Wessworth
and Abram Samra and Leah & her child or children to my
brother Uriah Wessworth
- Item 3rd I revoke that part of Item 5th of my will of September 13th
1854, which leaves my gold, watch and chain to Franklin
Wessworth, I bequeath said gold watch and chain to my
Nephew William Wessworth
- Item 4th I revoke so much of item 5th in the will aforesaid as relates to
Leah and her increase, I leave the said Leah and increase to my
beloved wife Sarah during her natural life, and at her death
I bequeath the said Leah and increase to my brother George
Wessworth
- Item 5th I revoke so much of item 5th in the will aforesaid as relates to
the negro boy Lawson, I bequeath the said boy to my Nephew Wiley
Wessworth
- Item 6th I revoke so much of Item 5th in the will aforesaid as relates
to the Mulatto boy Matthew, I leave the said boy to my beloved
wife Sarah and at her death, to have said Matthew appraised
by five disinterested men, and then sold, allowing him to select
his master, the proceeds of said sale to be distributed among my poor
relatives as in Item 8th of my will of September 13th 1854.
- Item 7th I declare this to be my last will and testament this 21st
November 1857, in presence of Thos. Burdell Wm. Wessworth Seal

State of Georgia 3 In the name of God Amen I Amelia Scarborough being of
Burke County 3 sound and disposing mind and memory and considering the
uncertainty of this mortal life do make and declare this my last will and
testament in manner and form following:

Item First It is my desire that after my death my body be decently buried in the burying
ground on the premises and near the house of David Perkins his

Item Second It is my will that all the notes due me be collected and as much of the money
as shall be necessary used to pay up all my just debts.

Item Third I give bequests and devise to my niece Emma Perkins my Negro man Solomon
to his sole and separate use for and during her natural life free and except from
the debts and liabilities of her future husband, if she should ever marry and
if she should die without children it is my will that the said Negro man Sol-
omon become the property of my younger niece Ida Amelia Perkins to have and to
hold for her own separate use for and during her natural life free and except
from the debts and liabilities of her future husband if she should ever marry.

Item Fourth I also give and bequeath to my niece Emma Perkins all my bedding and bed clothing
together with all the money which may be left after paying my debts to her sole and
separate use for and during her natural life.

Item Fifth I hereby constitute and appoint my friend David S. Perkins to be the guardian of said
property willed and bequeathed to my niece Emma Perkins.

Item Sixth I hereby constitute and appoint my friend David S. Perkins Executor of this my
last will and testament hereby revoking all others herefore made by me
Witness my hand and seal this the twenty seventh day of November in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty five.
