I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body to be buried in a decent Christian like manner revoking all former wills by me made at any former time.

Secondly I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth Brinson my lands and plantation where I may live also so much of my stock of all kinds of plantation tools horses hawks and hawks hunting furniture as she may think proper to select at my death to gether with the one year support to have during her natural life time or widowhood and at her death or intermarriage to be equally divided among my heirs in the terms of the last

Thirdly I give to my son A.C. Brinson one Horse Bridle and Saddle worth about Eighty Dollars

Fourthly I give to my daughter Nancy J. Brinson and Marriet C. Brinson each one bed with furniture worth about Twenty five Dollars each also Twenty dollars each in place

Fifthly of two Cows and calves that I had intended to give them each

I give my daughter Martha A. Brinson Twenty dollars in place of Two Cows and Calves.

Sixthly I give my Daughter Mary Wallace ten head of Stock Sheep in place of Two Cows and Calves. And as touching my slave property I dispose of it in the following manner I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth my negro man Mingo about fifty six or seven years of age also my negro woman named Lucia about thirty years of age and her two children namely Henry a boy about twelve years of age and Louisa a girl about sixteen months of age to have and to hold as long as she holds my lands and other property that I have given her and to be divided at her death or intermarriage among my heirs in the terms of this last and I further wish that after all the legacies as mentioned above be delivered up to the legatees that my execs proceed to sell and pay off all of my just debts as soon as convenient my Negro man Tom I wish to be first by my execs and that they make no division among them without Burke Co. to go to the expense of getting and ordering or advertising but to sell privately at whatever they believe to be a fair price for said Negro and I further more give my Negro man Lou the priviledge of choosing his master provided he Lou choose a man who can and will pay the price. I further wish that if my execs shall not have enough in hand to pay off all of my just debts that they proceed to sell one or more of my Negroes in the same manner as they did my man Tom and sell until they are able to pay off and doct pay all of my just debts and then ship and keep the rest to the best interest for the heirs so long as the heirs and execs deem it best and then to divide it equally among the heirs in the terms of the last and I further wish that if my Negro man Mingo should live longer than my beloved wife she at her making a division what he (Mingo) have the same of me alledge that I give my man Tom and I appoint and constitute my son Shephard Brinson and Simon Wallace execs to this my last will and testament signed and published this the 28 day of Aug 1854.
