all mankind since to die do accordingly make and ordain this as
my last will and Testament.

First of all I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body to be buried
in Christian form by my executors hereinafter named First of all
I direct my executors to pay all my just debts that shall be due at my
decease, and Secondly I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Williams
my wife now residing in the City of Savannah One hundred Dollars
in Cash to be paid by my executors as soon as it is demanded after
my decease, And all the balance of my Estate both real and personal
I have this day conveyed to my two Sons Ezekiel and William Whifield
and their mother Temperance Whifield by deed of gift bearing
even date with this my will to which instrument I affix my execu-
tors for further directions respecting the distribution of my Estate
and the government of my children. And I do appoint my worthy
friends Arthur Williams and Fielding Foye my executors to this my
last will and Testament
