

Georgia } I Henry Dillon of the County and state aforesaid

make this my last will & testament.

Item 1st I will that all my Just debts be paid.

Item 2nd I will that for the purpose of paying my debts, my
Executors hereafter named, be & they are hereby
authorised & instructed to sell any part or portion of
my estate, either real or personal, at private or public
Sale & without any order of Court, & upon such terms
& conditions as they may think best for the benefit of
my estate.

Item 3rd I will that after all my debts are paid, that the
balance of my estate shall be equally divided between
my wife & all my children, my Grand daughter, the
child of my daughter Sarah McClinton, drawing an
equal share with the rest of my legates & their heirs
forever, but should my said Grand child die before
marriage, her share is to return to, & be considered a part
of my estate & divided among the rest of my legates.

Item 4th If my executors think it best they are instructed
to purchase a place for my wife & minor children
to live on, & for their support, & to pay for the same
out of the shares of those who are thus provided for
but my executors are authorised at any time they
may think it best, to sell the same again & make an
equal division amongst all who are interested in the
aforesaid investment.

Item 5th I constitute my friends John W. Bierny & James A.
Stark Executors of this my last will & Testament.
