now Butts County. Also a negro girl Lucinda together
with such household furniture and personal estate as she
is in possession of now to have and to hold the same during
the time of her natural life.

Item 3rd At the death of my wife and myself I desire to
said lot of land, forever in fee simple to son Thomas McElre
and the said Negro girl Lucinda and her increase to my
daughter Elizabeth Beauchamp wife of John Beauchamp and
her heirs forever in fee simple.

Item 4th I bequeath to my son James McElre five Dollars
and no more

Item 5th I bequeath to my daughter Jane Deason
wife of Benjamin Deason fifty dollars and no more

Item 6th I bequeath to my daughter Nancy Gough wife
of Thomas Gough One hundred Dollars and no more

Item 7th I desire to my son John McElre lot of land
number one hundred in the first district originally Henry
now Butts County forever in fee simple

Item 8th I bequeath to my daughter Mary Deason wife of John
Deason my negro boy Felix forever in fee simple

Item 9th The whole residue of my estate of moveable and mind
whatever I desire may be sold by my executor and the
proceeds of such sale equally divided among my following
children to wit Thomas McElre, John McElre, Mary Deason
and Elizabeth Beauchamp or their representatives share and
share alike forever in fee simple

Item 10th Lastly I constitute and appoint my neighbour and
friend Thomas P. Atkinson executor of this my last will
and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me
