pleased God to bless me with do make and ordain this my
last will and testament in manner and form following that
is to say.

Item 1st I desire that my body should be buried in
a decent and Christian like manner and that all my
just debts and funeral expenses be paid.

Item 2nd I give to my beloved wife Mary the lot of land
number ninety nine in the first district originally Henry
now Butts County. Also a negro girl Lucinda together
with such household furniture and personal estate as she
is in possession of now to have and to hold the same during
the time of her natural life.

Item 3rd At the death of my wife and my self I devise to
said lot of land forever in fee simple to son Thomas W. W.
and the said negro girl Lucinda and her increase to my
daughter Elizabeth Beauchamp wife of John Beauchamp and
her heirs forever in fee simple.

Item 4th I bequeath to my son James W. W. five Dollars
and no more.

Item 5th I bequeath to my daughter Jane season
wife of Benjamin season fifty Dollars and no more.

Item 6th I bequeath to my daughter Nancy W. W. wife
of Thomas W. W. One hundred Dollars and no more.

Item 7th I devise to my son John W. W. lot of land
number one hundred in the first district originally Henry
now Butts County forever in fee simple.

Item 8th I bequeath to my daughter Mary season wife of John
season my negro boy Felix forever in fee simple.

Item 9th The whole residue of my estate of nature and kind
whatsoever I desire may be sold by my executor and the
proceeds of such sale equally divided among my following
children to wit Thomas W. W. John W. W. Mary season
and Elizabeth Beauchamp or their representatives share and
share alike forever in fee simple.

Item 10th Lastly I constitute and appoint my neighbor and
friend Thomas P. Atkinson executor of this my last will
and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me
