2^{dly} I wish my entire property to be kept together for the support and benefit of my beloved wife Ann Eliza Fielder and my beloved son Joseph Maleny Fielder, during the life time or widowhood of my beloved wife at her death or marriage (Should she ever marry) It is my wish that an equal distribution of my entire Estate be made between her and my beloved son Joseph Maleny Fielder provided however that at any time my beloved wife should desire it, she may with the consent of my Executor sell the bay Lindsey and buy or other or any other property they may agree on for the benefit of the Estate.

3^{dly} I constitute and appoint my beloved Father in law John McMichael my Executor who is charged with the Execution of this my last will and Testament.
