I Sarah Little of the County aforesaid
being of feeble health but of sound mind and discretion
and believing that it is a duty to my family to make
disposition of such property as I am in possession ~~of~~
will or testament do declare this to be my last will and
testament revoking all others heretofore made
Item first I consign my soul to my God with full faith in
the mediation of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ for
my hope of happiness in eternity and my body after my
death I trust to the care of my friends for the rites of a
Christian burial

Item second I give and bequeath to my grand daughter
Sarah Hissiah Douglass a negro girl named Phirly
about thirteen years old with her increase also a feather
bed and covering furniture and the same to be chosen
by my executor hereinafter named also a large straw
covered basket and a small trunk now in the house

Item third I give and bequeath to my grand daughter
Martha Abi Douglass a negro girl named Rose about
five years old and her increase also a feather bed
& covering furniture to be selected in like manner
pointed out for my grand daughter Sarah and of
equal value. Also I give Martha an iron bound chest
now in the house also my Ride saddle

And it is my will and desire in relation to the above property
or any other coming from my estate to said grand daughters
Sarah & Martha that the property to be vested in the hands and control
of my friend John Goodman of Bullo County to be by him
managed as a trustee for the benefit and support of my
said grand daughters and to see to it that if they marry
that the property and increase and profits shall not be

subject to the contracts and debts of the person or persons they may or either of them (Marry)

Item fourth I give and bequeath to my Grand son

Jeremiah Denny Daughan a feather bed and covering, furniture to be of the value of and selected in like manner pointed out for my grand daughter and I also appoint John Goodman his Guardian to manage whatever may go to him from my estate

Item fifth I give and bequeath to my husband John

Milbra during his lifetime two negroes to wit: Harbary and her son Slavery to be for his support and maintenance and it is my will and desire that my executor herein after named see that the property I bequeath to my husband shall be appropriated for his support in such manner as my husband wishes

Item sixth It is my will and desire that my other

Negro property not herein before disposed of and also my lands lying a lot originally Henry now Butts County of two hundred acres more or less also a lot of land in the Cherokee purchase all to be sold by my said executor and to be equally divided between my grandchildren Sarah and Martha and Charles and Alexander and Jeremiah Daughan the division of the same to be made in such manner that the boys to be made equals with what I have given to the girls, and for ~~purpose~~ that purpose the negroes given the girls to be valued to be valued by disinterested persons to be named by my executor that all my grand children shall ^{share} equally of my estate and if the negroes given the girls are not of equal value then the deficiency to be paid in cash the negroes to be valued at any time to be convenient for my executor

Item seventh It is my will and desire that after the death of my husband John Milbra that my executor sell the negroes I have given my husband and the proceeds to be equally divided among my said Grand Children or if they or any of them be dead at the time then to their representatives and heirs

Item eighth If I have any notes on hand I wish them collected to be divided as my other property

Item ninth It is my will and desire that if my husband wishes my grand daughter Sarah and Martha to remain and live with him that he shall keep their property also as long as he desires

Item tenth All my other effects and property not named I give and bequeath to said husband to do with as he wishes

Item eleventh I constitute and appoint James R. Milbra of Butts County Georgia Executor to this my last

will and testament and that in carrying the same into effect that he shall not be obliged to obtain orders from the court but his judgment to direct in every instance
