That is to say that I render my soul to God who gave when separated from my body, request that my body be buried in a plain and Christian like manner and as regards the little amount of property with which it has been pleased God to bless me my will is first that all my just, that all my just debts be paid out of the sale of my personal property & present crop of Corn and Cotton or much as will be sufficient to pay the same. The Residue of all my personal property together with my land being lot no 88 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> district of Carroll County now Campbell County, I give and bequeath unto my ~~Wife~~ beloved Mother free from the Control or Custody of her husband for & during her natural life & at her death to be sold and equally divided between all of my Brothers & Sisters. My executor will collect all debts due me and apply it to the payment of what I owe. This note given by Mr South to Breckenridge Hinton or bearer for Cash, I am security on said note; the interest that is coming to Mr South out of the Crop, he has helped me to make this year I want it, applied to the payment of said note and sum then satisfied. And for the purpose of carrying this my last will & Testament into effect I do hereby appoint George M. Doach executor to the same in witness whereof I have

signed my name and seal of office this 15<sup>th</sup> day of August 1858
