that I make a will or disposition of the property
with which a kind providence has blessed me with
I therefore make this my last will and testament
Revoking all others.

Item I desire that my body be buried in a Christian
like manner and my soul I trust will return in peace to the
God who gave it.

Item I desire that all my debts be paid with out
delay by my Executors hereinafter named believing that
there is a sufficient due me to pay all my just debts
but should there not be a enough I leave it
with my Executors to pay as they see fit

37 Prosperity as I shall be my own for that purpose
I then the 5th of June and I will to my beloved wife
Jane Camp my entire Estate both real and
Personal During her natural life or will ordered
to have full power and control of the same
to raise and Educate my Children, with the following
Exceptions, I will and Bequeath to my Eldest Joseph
B. Camp a Negro boy named Jerry about three
years of age to him & to the use of his body and should
he depart this life with out & heir for the said
Negro boy to revert back & be Equally divided
among my other Children & I further will and
bequeath to my said son Joseph one horse bridle &
Saddle to be worth twenty five dollars the value,
I further will & Bequeath unto my son James
B. Camp one Negro boy named Vanburin
about one year of age in the same manner
and form as is described in Joseph's and further for
said son James to have a horse bridle & Saddle
Equivalent to Joseph's and should either of the
above named Negros Will to my two Sons live
before they die I desire and Request
that they have a mother one worth as much
as the ours all ready named and for my Executors
to deliver to them the above named property at
such time as they may think best for their advan-
tage, and for my beloved wife Jane to hold and
have all the use of my Estate until such time
as any other one of my Children shall come of
Age or marry and shall need any assistance and
at such time for any one of my Children not named
to have a Negro named to be worth as much as
either of my other Sons all ready named and
I will & bequeath to all such of my Children such
Negros as they may desire to them & to their heirs

one of them should receive any of my property ²⁴⁰
and should depart this life leaving no heir for
the same to revert back to be equally divided a-
mong the Rest of my Children and for each
one of them to have a horse bridle and Saddle —
Equivalent to my Two Sons already named.

When the 4th I will and desire that should my wife, Mary
a gain that there be a division of the whole of my
Estate both Real & personal and that my wife be
entitled unto a child's part to use as she may wish
and should she have other heirs after her mar-
riage I desire that they at her death have
an equal share of her part of the Estate with
my Children.

When the 5th I will and desire that should my
wife not marry that she have and keep together
all my Estate both Real and personal during her
natural life with the Exceptions already named and
at her death for this to be an equal division a-
mong all my Children so as to make them all
Equal in my Estate,

When the 6th I will and appoint my beloved
Wife, Jane Campbell and my Brother, Lucius
James M. Campbell my Executors to this my last
Will and Testament, signed Sealed and Secured by Alfred
J. Campbell as his last Will & Testament in the presence
of us the undersigned witnesses who subscribe our
Names here unto in the presence the Executor and
of each other this the 17th day of July 1844
