State of Georgia } In the Name of God Amen  
Campbell County } I Amisted Bonner Son of the  
County and State aforesaid being  
of sound mind and disposing memory but know-  
ing that it is appointed unto all men to  
die do make this my last will and testament  
in manner and form following to wit.  
first, I give and bequeath my soul to God  
Second, my desire is to be buried in a decent  
and Christian like manner,  
Third, concerning my worldly effects I desire  
that a reasonable quantity of land be attached  
to my Mill and Farm and to be sold to pay my  
just debts or so much of any other property  
as my executors may think most advisable for  
the same.

(4th) fourth I give and bequeath all the remain-  
der of my property to my wife Elizabeth Bonner  
during her natural life or widowhood and at  
her death to be disposed of in the following  
manner to wit. (4th) first I give and be-  
queath unto my Son Spencer Bonner All  
that Body of Land lying before the said  
commencing at the Tree and running with the  
same to the mouth and as the River now runs  
the mill until it comes to when said

Thence across the Creek parallel to Austin A.  
Arnolds Land thence along said Arnolds Line to  
the River and up the west side of the River to the  
Beginning; I also bequeath to my Son Spencer Bonner  
Two Thousand Acres of land commencing at  
the mouth of the Lane running from the Ferry in  
a direct line to the Big Spring thence from said  
Spring to the Rock ~~line~~ of No one hundred and  
sixty so as to include two hundred acres after  
deducting what is allowed for the mill.

I also Bequeath to my Son Spencer Bonner my  
Medical Books I also Bequeath to my Son Spencer  
One Old Negro Woman by the name of Jessie at  
the nomination of Aristocratic Men as a part of  
his Dividende of my Estate

(2nd) I give and bequeath unto my Granddaughter  
Elizabeth Rice Daughter of Thos S. Ward soon  
Rice a certain Negro Girl by the name of  
Martha. ~~\$100~~

(3rd) I give and bequeath unto my Daughter  
Sarah Francis Bonner widow of my Deceased son  
Elisha S. Bonner \$100 Dollars.

(4th) I give and bequeath unto my Grandson  
Elisha S. Bonner Son of Elisha and Sarah Francis Bonner  
\$300, or

(5th) It is my will and desire that all the  
Land on the west side of the River above the  
Lane be divided in two lots as my Executors  
may think most proper and to be sold for  
the benefit of My heirs after the death of my  
wife also all my Land on the east side of the  
Chattahoochee River from the Town of Campbellton  
to be sold after the death of my wife for the  
use of My heirs and it also further Desire that  
all my Space after leaving a sufficient

County of Campbellton and on the east side  
of the Chattahoochee to be divided into three  
parts as my Executors may direct to be sold after  
the death of wife for the benefit of my heirs  
also I desire all my lands lying in the State  
of South Carolina to be sold as my Executors  
think proper for the benefit of my heirs  
I will and desire all my Property Real &  
personal not otherwise wise bequeathed to be  
sold after the death of my wife to the highest  
bidder and the proceeds thereof equally divided  
amongst my children to wit My Daughter  
Susan McMullin Mary Rice & Son John  
Bonar Spencer Bonar and Amisted Bonar  
on their Heirs.

(6<sup>th</sup>) I do hereby appoint my Spencer Bonar  
and Edward S. Bonar My lawful Executors  
to this my last will and Testament revoking  
all other wills here before made by me.  
In witness whereof I have hereunto set  
my hand and affixed my Seal this Twenty  
Eighth day of December 1839

of sound mind & memory and that the testator did  
execute the same freely without compulsion  
so far as these deponents know or believe,
