Georgia Campbell County Wills 1833 to 1862
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In the name of God Amen.
 I, Clary Gibson of the County
 of Campbell and State of Georgia being at this
 time of sound mind and disposing memory
 but being advanced in years and knowing that
 life is uncertain and also have a wish and
 desire, that my worldly Estate and Effects should
 be disposed of to my own wish and liking after
 my death I do therefore make Constitute and
 declare, this writing to be my last will and Testament
 to wit.

When the first I resign my Soul to God who gave
 it and my body I wish to be neatly and decently
 interred without any great Expence pomp or
 parade.

When the second I will and bequeath unto my
 Son William M. Butt and Negro Man Slave by the name
 of Jingo Also the Tract or Fraction of Land on
 which he now resides to wit Sixteen hundred

Sixty six in the ninth district of Coweta County
originally now Campbell County to have and to hold
the said will and bequeath negro man and the said
fraction of land to him and his heirs and assigns and
proper use benefit and behoof for ever in person
file.

Item the third I will and bequeath unto the children
of my daughter Susan Ann I will the sum
of Fifty dollars in cash to be equally divided
between them by my Executors within twelve months
after the proving of this my last will and
Testament

Item the fourth I will and bequeath unto my
daughter Sarah B. Ball those negroes to wit
Wiley a negro woman about thirty two
years old and her three children to wit male
Lina about four years old and Rhoda about
two years old and their increase if any
they should have also the tract or fraction of
land on which she now resides to wit
fraction number sixteenth in the ninth
district of originally Coweta now Campbell
County to have and to hold said negroes
and land to her and her heirs and assigns and
proper use benefit and behoof for ever in
person also a negro man by the name
of Lewis or Lewis.

Item the fifth I will and bequeath to my
son Jesse M. Butts two negro men slaves to
wit Dennis a negro man about forty five years
old and Ben or Benjamin about twenty eight years
old and also the lot or tract of land at which
I now reside, to wit lot of land number sixty
two in the ninth District of originally Coweta
now Campbell County to have and to hold

27 Said will and bequeath 113,000 I said to
his and his heirs and assigns own prop-
erty benefit and behoof for ever in per-
petuity.

Item the Sixth After setting off enough of the
reminders of my Estate not particularly will be
to pay ~~all my just debts and~~ demands that
may be gained ~~on~~ my Estate and paying fifty
dollars to my daughter Susan Ann O. Holt ~~as~~
as specified in the second item of this my last
will and Testament the balance that may be
left of my Estate both real or personal to be
equally divided between my daughter Sarah B. Ball
and my son Jesse M. Butt.

Item the Seventh For the purpose of carrying this
my last will and Testament into effect and
for the better having the same executed agreeable
to the true intent and meaning thereof that justice
may be done to all interested in the same
I appoint my son Jesse M. Butt my Executor
of this my last will and Testament.

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In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
name and affixed my seal to this my last
will and Testament and by this do revoke all pre-
vious wills or bequests by me made This the
fourth day of August Eighteen hundred and thirty
seven.
