5th Item I do give and bequeath to my son James M
Wm One fort acre Lot of Land & several houses
and land ~~as~~ originally Rehester now Campbell

Madison Sherman for her sole and separate
use for ever during her natural life free
and exempt from the debts and liabilities of her
present or future husband, the following property
to wit: Seventy five and an quarter acres (75 1/4) ~~acres~~

April 21 originally hundred now Campbell County,
Geo. Stein I do give and bequeath to my son John C.
Winn one lot of land containing forty acres
more or less 180 Seven thousand & thirty 27/33
Originally hundred now Campbell County,
Geo. Stein I do give and bequeath to my two daughters
Mary & Ellen Winn my negro woman servant
about Twenty Two years of age.

Geo. Stein I do give and bequeath to my wife Winn
three hundred dollars (\$300.00) to be paid him in
view of Land,

Geo. Stein I do give and bequeath to my son George A. Winn
forty six acres (46) of Land in the South West
corner of Lot No 200 two hundred and forty three
(203),

Geo. Stein I do give and bequeath to my son Alan D. Winn
forty six acres of Land in the South East corner of
Lot No 200 two hundred and forty three (203).

Geo. Stein I do give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret C.
Winn my negro girl Rhoda about two years old,
Geo. Stein I do give to my wife Priscilla Winn forty
six & acres of Land more or less in the north
west corner of Lot No 200 two hundred and forty
three containing all the houses and to have

after her death the above named estate to go to Thos. M. Wren
Also I give to my wife my negro boy King about twenty
five years of age, to have and to hold during her
lifetime and after her death King is to be sold and
the money equally divided among the legatees.
Also I give to my wife my pair of mules and
Mugaw together with all the house hold and
Kitchen furniture and all the Farming utensils
cils and stock of all kinds over man
and farm house.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my son
John W. Wren Executor of this my last will and
testament. This 25th day of December 26th 1861
