Campbell County & State afore said being
of sound & disposing mind memory, but being of
delicate health & knowing the uncertainty of human
life & being desirous of having my worldly goods &
property disposed of to my own choosing & liking
do therefore make ordain & publish this writing my last
Will & Testament - I term the first - I resign my soul
to God who gave it, and my will & desire is that
my body be interred in a plain & suitable Coffin
without any pomp or parade - I term the second
I will & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth
Geyer one dollar in money in addition to what
I have hitherto fore given her & no more - I term the
third I will & bequeath to my daughter Mary Geyer
a certain negro fellow slave by the name of
Peter - but my daughter Mary is not to receive
said negro nor his services until after the death
of my wife Mary Whitted unless my wife should inter-
marry again & in that event my daughter Mary Geyer
shall take said negro fellow Peter in to possession
as soon thereafter as may be convenient for her
so to do after the intermarriage of my wife Mary
Whitted. I term the fourth I will & bequeath to my son
William Whitted one dollar in money in addition
to what I have hitherto fore given him & no more
I term the fifth - I will & bequeath to my daughter
Nancy Geyer one dollar in money in addition
to what I have hitherto fore given her & no more
I term the sixth I will & bequeath to my son
Javis Collins Whitted one dollar in money in ad-
dition to what I have hitherto fore given him & no more
I term the seventh - I will & bequeath to my
daughter Margaret Neal one dollar in money in
addition to what I have hitherto fore given her

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I Item the Eighth - I will & bequeath to my daughter
- Emma Sumner having two negroes slaves to wit
a negro Girl by the name of Lucy about eight
years old & a boy by the name of Henry about ten
years old to have & to hold said will'd. & bequeath
these negroes to her & her heirs' own proper use
benefit & behoof & also the increase of said negro
Girl if she should have any forever in fee simple.
I Item the ninth I will & bequeath to my
daughter Julia Smith a negro boy by the name
of Lewis about six years old in addition to what
I have here before given her the said negro boy
she & her heirs are to have & to hold to their own
proper use benefit & behoof forever - I Item
the tenth I will & bequeath to my wife Mary
all that after paying all my just debts & paying
off the other legacies the amount in money that
I am Will'd then in this my last will & testament
all the residue of my property of every kind
in Exemption & left the following named negroes
to wit Peter a negro fellow & Elisabeth a negro
woman & her child by the name of Madison who
with the said several negroes to wit Peter Elisabeth
& Madison & Elisabeth's increase if she should have
any I leave to my wife Mary All'ted during her
natural life or so long as she may remain
my widow for her own proper use & benefit
and at her death or interment the said
negroes & their increase if any are to be
Equally divided between my two daughters Julia
Smith & Emma King that is Elisabeth Madison &
Peter are to go to & be the property of my daughter
Emma to stand it over this my last will & testament

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I then the Eleven the 7th to the 11th of the month.

Carrying this my last will & testament into Effect & the
Publishing the same I ~~am~~ hereby in solemn Custody & app-
arance my wife ~~William~~ Whitted & my friend and
in law ~~William~~ Smith the Executors to this my last
will & ~~testament~~ - I in writing, whereof I have the
the nineteenth day of May in the year of our Lord
Eighteen hundred & thirty four ~~that~~ I signed my
& affixed my seal to this my last will & Testament
revoaking all ~~other~~ former wills, Deeds of Gift
powers, of attorney & all other instruments of writing
that may be in Contradiction to Effect this will
