Wednesday morning last the fourth day
of April in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and forty nine
at the Residence of Grant Richards where
Mr. Jacob Redwine was on a visit and
interrupted by sickness and Died, About
four hours before his death, in perfect
possession of his mental faculties he called
for Mr. Grant Richards and in our
presence requested of him to make the following
disposition of his property first he said I wish
my Father John Redwine, to have my saddle
and bridle, I wish the negro girl
Lucinda to be given to Mr. To to prove
he will consent to take her back, I
wish all my debts paid I wish my wife
Emily H. Redwine to have my negro man
Gelin and all other property that I possess
shortly afterwards he breathed his last
April 3rd 1849
