I Will that my body be decently buried and burial
expenses paid, and that all my just debts be paid
I Will that at my death, my wife Eliza Jones have
and possess all my estate both real and personal,
during her lifetime or widowhood.

I Will and empower my wife Eliza Jones that in
case if any of my sons or daughters should
marry or leave, for her to give each or any of
them such furniture as she may ^{think} proper.

I Will that my daughters (viz) Nancy & James, Eliza
Ann & James, Melissa Evelyn Jones & Cleopatra
Jones, shall have at my wife's death, two hundred
dollars each in cash.

I also Will that my three grand children of my
daughter Martha Brown (viz) Eliza Ann Brown
James V. Brown, Mary E. Brown each to have
Fifty Dollars in cash.

I Will, that at my wife's death (Eliza Jones) the
remaining portion of my estate real & personal
to be equally divided between my six sons
(viz) Francis M. Jones, James E. Jones, William
J. Jones, Edward J. Jones, John V. Jones, and
Benjamin E. Jones

I Appoint James E. Jones and William
Jones my lawfull executors, April 26th 1854
