me, in the following manner,

1st I bequeath my Estate both real and personal
debts due and demands of every kind and
description, with my beloved wife and children
to be kept together until my oldest child
becomes of age, then it to draw its proportion-
able share of all my Estate, then the balance
of my Estate to remain with my wife until
my next child is of age, then it to draw
its proportionable share until
my youngest child is of age, unless my wife should
marry sooner than the times above mentioned
then I want an equal division of all
my Estate with her and my children at
the expiration of her Widowhood.

2nd I will and desire that all of the moneys
due to me from every and all sources shall
be collected by my Executors and placed
out on interest in that way which my said
Executors shall deem best for the benefit of
my said wife and children.

3rd I bequeath it discretionary with my wife
and my Executors if they shall think it
advisable to make sale of my real Estate to
do so or not as they think best.

4th I hereby appoint my Brother-in-law Christopher
Bower and my wife Catharine McRoy
carried up

to be my lawful executor to the my last
will and Testament.

 time of sound mind and disposing memory
 but being advanced in years and knowing that
 life is uncertain and also have a wish and
 desire, that my worldly Estate and Effects should
 be disposed of to my own wish and liking after
 my death I do therefore make constitute and
 declare, this writing to be my last will and testament
 to wit.

When the first I resign my soul to God who gave
 it and my body I wish to be neatly and decently
 interred without any great Expence pomp or
 parade.

Then the said I will and bequeath under my
 son William M. Butte one Negro man slave by the name
 of Lingo Also the tract or plantation of land on
 which he now resides to wit Emotion number
