1st Item, I desire & direct that my body be
buried in a plain and Christian like
manner suitable to my circumstances
in life my soul I commit to God who gave
it.

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2^d Item I direct that all my just
debts be paid by my Executors hereafter appointed.
3rd Item I give bequeath & desire to my
beloved wife Francis Elizabeth for and
during her natural life & at her death
to be equally divided among all my children
now born & hereafter to be born to me by
her, with the exceptions hereafter mentioned.
All my Estate both real & personal and
she is to keep the children together &
raise & educate them without charge
to them from the rents & profits of said
Estate & if the rents & profits of said
Estate & the sale of such surplus personal
property that I have that my wife may
sell that she does not need to
direct that all surplus personal

property be such that it may not actually be needed
by her & the money put out at interest
for the use & benefit & in trust for my
Children as well as the yearly surplus of
rents & profits of my Estate,

4th Item In case my wife should ^{marry} again
I direct that when my youngest child
becomes of age that all my Estate & effects
then be equally divided among all my
Children & my wife only to take a
Childs part & use the same during
her natural life & at her death said
part to be equally divided among all
my children,

5th Item I hereby constitute & appoint my
beloved wife Frances Elizabeth Denton
and my Brother Joe Brock my Executors
of this my last will & Testament.
