2^d I will my beloved wife Mary the fraction of land that I now live on with two small fractions North of the same & fraction No. (1/2 230) town hindman and thirty in the same Dist. of Campbell County the buildings and machinery on said premises until my youngest child shall arrive to the age of sixteen then to be sold and divided amongst my ~~lawful~~ heirs, & I give and bequeath to my said wife Mary one years provision to be taken out of the present crop also My old Mare two Cows & Calves six sheep one sow & pigs my house hold & kitchen furniture

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3^d to make my three sons now living with me Equal with the other two I will and bequeath to each of them one horse saddle & bridle namely to my son John C. Clinton I bequeath my own horse saddle & bridle to my son Samuel C. Clinton I bequeath my Rainier filly saddle & bridle to my son Christopher C. Clinton I bequeath my black rock filly saddle and bridle

4^d To make my three Daughters now living with me equal to the one that has left me I give and bequeath to each as follows to my daughter Lydia Ann I bequeath one cow & calf and one feather head to my daughter Elizabeth C. Clinton I bequeath one cow & calf & one feather head

to my daughter Charlotte Clinton I bequeath one
cord and calf and one featherbed the above
three featherbeds & furniture to be given at the
discretion of this mother

5th I will that all the heallance of my ~~land~~
lands with all my Negroes with all the heallance
of my property whatever not otherwise disposed
of except one three quarter waggon and one
yoke of sters to be disposed of here after to
be advertised according to law and sold on
a credit of twelve months with approved
security and the proceeds to be equally divided
between my nine children Namely Sarah
Ann Hill, James McClinton John
H Clinton Samuel R Clinton Christo
pher C Clinton Lydia Ann Clinton
Elizabeth L Clinton Charlotte Clinton &
David Clinton the waggon and sters
along with ~~the~~ ^{the} bequeath to
my wife Mary for the use of the
plantation I hereby appoint and ordain
my wife Mary Clinton & my son John
H Clinton Executors of this my last will

now in my possession to her and her heirs to
be disposed of as she may think proper.

2nd I give and bequeath unto my said James
Rouin lot of land known as number one
hundred and thirty two in the tenth District of
Carroll County for his special use and benefit
so long as he lives and not to be subject to his
debts in any way; and after his death the said
lot or its proceeds to be equally divided between his
two youngs Sons Loren & Vincent Rouin.

3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter
Sara John Rouin and his heirs a negro boy
named Scot which he now has in his possession
in fee simple forever.
