I John Little of the County of
Campbell and State of Georgia
being of sound mind and mem-
ory and considering the uncertain-
ty of this frail and transitory
life do therefore make in plain public
and declare this to be my last
Will and Testament, that is to say
first after all my lawfull debts
are paid and discharged the residue
of my estate real and personal, I give
bequeath and dispose of as follows
I give to my beloved wife the same
and appurtenances situated thereon
lying in the County of Campbell and
State of Georgia, Together with one negro
woman Eliza and all my stock, Wagon
& Buggy and farming implements and
crops growing or getting in and all my
money and debts due me and all
of my house hold and kitchen furniture
now possessed by me during the term of
her natural life or life of widowhood
after her death or intermarriage it is my
desire that all shall be sold and equally
divided between her and my three
children: Thomas & James, William &
Mary Elizabeth & Sarah Jane & John & Jonas
Whitman I make constitute and
appoint Willis Morgan to be executor
of this my last will & Testament
