& perfect mind and memory, blessed be
Almighty God for the same, do make and
publish this my last Will and Testament.
First I give and bequeath unto my
wife Mary McLarty and all of the tract of
land I now live on during her natural
life and at her death to descend to be
the property of my son Archibald M.
McLarty with all the buildings and
appurtenances thereof I moreover
Will to my said wife my negro man
Anthony and my negro Girl Louince.
My two mules all my stock of Cattle
and ~~my negro man~~ for simple to be
her own right & property and to
dispose of in any way she may think
proper. I likewise give to my eldest son
Alexander McLarty five dollars, I give to son
M. McLarty five dollars. I give to my son John
McLarty five dollars. I give to my son
George M. McLarty five dollars. And to
my son Stephen M. McLarty five dollars.
And to my daughter Caroline Maxwell five
dollars. And to my son Archibald
M. McLarty five dollars. And I will
to my daughter Margaret Maxwell five
dollars, which said several legacies
or sums of money I will & order shall
be paid to the respective legatees within
six months after my decease. And
lastly I give the remainder of all

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my property of every kind whatsoever to
my beloved wife Mary M. Larty after
paying my just debts. And lastly
I appoint my sons Samuel M. M. Larty
and Frederick M. M. Larty sole Executors
of this my last Will & Testament and hereby
revoking all former Wills by me made.
This given under my hand and seal
the 21st day of ~~December~~ December 1853.

By the last Will & Testament of Thomas
McKay (senior) decreed of the property then

land upon which he now lives.
So hereby for divers good causes and
considerations now hereunto moving
and in pursuance of the will in the
fourth ~~item~~ of said will authorizing me
so to do, I have given up and forever
relinquish my right to said trusteeship
and further in pursuance of the said
clause in the said will contained -

I as hereby in Court
appoint my trusty friend Alfred B. Davis
of the County & State aforesaid to act in the
premises as trustee to the said property
and to the said Alfred B. Davis
hereby authorize and empower him
to perform all and every act and thing
touching said estate in the premises
I myself could & of right ought to do in
relation to the same.
