self, that I should make a disposition
of the property with which a kind Providence
has blessed me, do therefore make this my
Last Will and Testament, hereby Revoking
all others heretofore made by me.

1st Item: I desire & direct, that my body be
buried in decent and Christian like manner,
suitable to my Circumstances and condition
in life. My soul, I trust, shall return to
rest with God who gave it, as I hope for
eternal life through the merits &
intercession of the blessed Lord & Saviour
Jesus Christ, whose Religion I have professed
and as I humbly trust, enjoyed for thirty
years.

2nd Item: I desire and direct, that all my just debts
be paid, without by any Executors having the
disposition, as I am unwilling my estate
should be delayed in their rights, especially
as there is no necessity for delay.

3rd Item: I give, bequeath, to my beloved wife Elizabeth
with whom I have lived in the strictest
quint for thirty four years, all my estate
both real & personal (except the part of my real
estate herein after bequeathed to my children
(or child) Mary Thomas wife of John Thomas
(Corrie) lot of land No 128, 118 containing
148 acres, half of lot No 115, making four

of age; my said wife & former
hereinafter appointed my agent
impowered (if they are proper)
to any of my said children, heirs
and portions of said negro property
the same being valued by David [unclear]
persons; after the death of my said wife
all my property both real & personal to be
divided equally among my said children
with the Conditions hereinafter mentioned
my sons Leander & James J. Parker
I desire to have the sum of seven hundred
& twentyfive dollars & my son John
the sum of six hundred & fifty five dollars
to make them equal with this amount
I have already given to my daughter
Mary Campbell [unclear] bequeath to
my beloved wife all of my personal
property of every description for & during
her natural lifetime or widowhood
if my said wife should marry
she is to be entitled to a child's part
during her lifetime & after her death
her part to go to my said children.
Item 5th I give, bequeath & desire to my son John
A. Parker after the death of my said
wife lot of land No 124 One hundred
& forty two acres of lot No 171 & the west half
of lot of land No 175 in the 9th District of
originally Fayette now Campbell County
making four hundred & forty five
acres More or less with all the rights
members & privileges to said parcels
of land in anywise appertaining or

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and forever; also an Equal interest
Personal property of any description
Death (or widowhood) of my said

I give & bequeath to my son Charles
D. Barker after the death of my said wife
Lot of Land No 97, Containing Two
hundred two & a half acres ~~and~~
~~fully~~ acres in the Southwest Corner
of Lot No 98 all in the fourth District
of originally Orkney now Campbell
County also an equal interest in all
my personal property after the death
of my said wife (or widow hereof) of every
kind.

7 Item: I give & bequeath to my son James
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Lot No 98 & 99 & 92 acres of Lot No 176 in
the 14th District of Originally DeKalb
now Campbell County, Also an equal
Interest in all my personal property after
the Death of my said wife.

8th Item: I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary C. Thayer, wife of John C. Thayer and all her children free from the disposition of her present or any future husband, Lot of land No 123 in the 7th District of originally Haystack now Campbell County containing two hundred two & a half acres more or less; also an equal interest in all my personal property (after deducting seven hundred & twenty five dollars

which she has already had (after the
Death of my said wife) free from the
control of her present fraudulent husband
her own, and I appoint my son John
A. Parker Trustee of the property herein
given & bequeathed to my beloved Daughter
Mary A. During her natural life after
her Death to go to her children.

I humbly Constitute and appoint
my beloved wife Elizabeth and my
son John A. Parker Executors &
Administrators of this my last Will & Testament
this 13th day of November 1852.
