Item 1st I desire that my body be ^{decently} buried, in a christian
like manner.

Item 2nd ~~My~~ My boy Aaron about 8 years
old I bequeath to Martha my wife, and
Susan about 12 years old to her children
by me, provided there should be any
by our marriage, and in case there
should be none, then ^{she} Susan is to have
to the balance of my estate.

Item 3rd Campbell County Wills 1833 to 1862
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I desire to be sold and all my just debts for
settled and the remainder equally divided
between my Lawful Legatee.

Item 4th I appoint my sons Thomas & Benjamin
Camps Co-jointly my executors of this
my last Will & Testament.

the presence of the Testator, and at his special
instance & request, and in the presence of
each other

I will and bequeath to my wife Rebecca
C. Brad, all my house hold and kitchen
furniture, Plantation tools of all descriptions and
my cattle, stock hogs, One yoke of Oxen, and one
cart, and one bay horse and all the land
whether or claim, and one negro woman
named Lucy, One Carriage & Harness.
I will & bequeath the above named
property to my wife Rebecca C. Brad during
