 the time I shall be called to my long wished
 for home, do make ordain and declare this to
 be my last will and Testament (herby revoking
 all others) in manner and form following viz.
 First of all I give my Soul to God who gave it and
 my body to be buried in plain Christian like manner at
 W-T

37 I have made my execution not doubting but
that it will be read again in the morning of
the Resurrection and as to the worldly goods wherewith
it hath pleased God to bless me I dispose of in the follow-
ing manner viz I will and bequeath to my dear
daughter Eleanor Tiger, who has and is now taking
care of me in my blind State of affliction she
and her bodily heirs a certain negro woman slave
named Seydia and her issue if she should have any
Also Receipt on Evan Howell for two notes on
A Horton and Michael Howell two hundred dollars
each the one due 22nd day of October 1834 and
the other due 30th October 1835 which said notes
were given by the Said A. Horton and Michael
Howell for a certain negro man slave named
Harry sold by my direction to the Said A. Horton
The balance of my goods & money I design to be
used by my Executors in carrying out my several purposes
Lastly I constitute and appoint my worthy trusty
and well tried friend Parker M. Wier my sole
Executor to execute this my last will & Testament

Tenth day of May A. D. (1837) Eighteen hundred
and Thirty Seven
