Eleanor Garbrough one cow & calf & further bequeath
signature.

4th I desire that all my just debts be paid
5th I desire that my beloved Wife Nancy Garbrough keep
the possession of all the property untill my Children
shall become of age

6th I give & bequeath unto my Sons Moriah Garbrough
George Charles Garbrough 1 Dollar in Cash
I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Sarah Mary one dollar
in Cash

And I do hereby constitute and appoint
my Wife Nancy Garbrough Sole Executrix
of this my last Will and Testament;
