a great while depart this life, deem it right  
and proper that as respects myself and family  
that I should make a disposition of the property  
which a kind providence has blessed me with.  
I do therefore make this my last will and  
testament hereby revoking all others before  
made by me.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I direct that my body be buried in a  
decent and Christian like manner suitable  
to my circumstances and condition in life  
by the side of second wife in the County of  
Campbell Georgia State my soul I  
trust shall return to God who gave it as I  
hope for eternal salvation through the merits  
and atonement of the blessed Lord and  
Savior Jesus Christ whose religion I have  
professed and as I hope and humbly trust  
enjoyed for many years.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I direct and desire that all my  
just debts shall be paid by my Executors  
hereafter named as I am unwilling that  
any of my creditors should be delayed in their  
rights when there will be no necessity for delay.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved  
wife Nancy P. Faulkner as her own right  
and property to dispose of as she may think  
proper a Negro man by the name of  
Nose of yellow complexion about

Twenty one years of age. my horse and buggy  
such as I may own at the time of my death  
a choice Cow and calf one good bedstead  
stead and furniture and two thousand  
Dollars in Cash. I also give and devise  
to my said wife Nancy & for and during  
her natural life a negro girl by the name  
of Nancy about nine or ten years of  
age. and at the ~~time~~ death of my  
said wife I direct that said negro  
girl Nancy shall go to and be reared in  
Eliza Smith wife of Archabald Smith  
and her children not to be subject to  
the debts or credits of said Archabald  
Smith her present or any future hus-  
band she may have.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I will and direct that all my  
property <sup>Campbell County Wills 1833 to 1862</sup> <sup>www.georgiapioneers.com</sup> of every  
description that I may be possessed  
of at the time of my death (except  
that mentioned in the previous items  
shall be sold by my Executors and  
when the proceeds shall be collected  
with all debts of every description due  
to me and when so collected the same  
shall be divided as follows (to wit)  
That my beloved daughter Elizabeth  
Russell wife W<sup>m</sup> Russell shall have  
five hundred dollars. That Antine  
J. Cherry shall have five hundred dollars  
That all the remainders shall then be  
equally divided between Jane Jackson  
William C. Cloud Thomas C. Hicks and  
Peter Hicks.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I do hereby constitute and

appoint my brother in the church  
and friend Nathan Breed and my  
friend Robert J. Luggle Executors of this  
my last will and testament to carry  
into effect this my last will and testa-  
ment at and after my death. In testa-  
ment of the same I have signed with  
my own hand and sealed with my seal  
this the 31<sup>st</sup> day of January 1861
