of Campbell County State of Georgia being
feeble in body but of sound mind do make
and ordain this my last will and testament
in manner and form following to wit—
It is my will and desire that all my Just
debts be paid and satisfied after which it is
my desire and I do here by give to my well
beloved wife Catharine Paullett all my Estate
both real and personal during her lifetime
and after her death I dispose of said Estate
as follows— I give to my son Lewis M. Paullett
^{and to my daughter Elizabeth M. Michael I give five hundred dollars}
five hundred dollars— To my son Henry Paullett
I give the tract of Land on which I now reside
and during his mother's lifetime for him to
remain and work as much as he sees fit
— free of rent— and I give to my son
Henry for services rendered through life five
hundred dollars— I give to my son Stephen
Paullett five hundred dollars and to my daughter
Elixa Anna Paullett I give and bequeath the
sum of five hundred dollars with which
my Executor here in after named if he may
deem it advisable may purchase a negro for
her benefit during life after her death
to go with the increase of her body, if he should
purchase a female to the lawful heirs of her
body If my Estate should not be sufficient
to pay the above legacies legacies it is my desire
that each of my legacies ~~should~~ have in an
equal proportion— Having perfect confidence
in my son Henry Paullett, I do hereby constitute
him my Executor to this my last will and
testament which he has read and all other wills

Therefore made by myself

January in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and thirty five -
