& Malinda Shelmut and Mary V. Smith my grand  
daughter and in case of the death of my said  
beloved daughter Malinda Shelmut then her part to  
go to her children & it is further my will that the  
part which falls to my said beloved daughter Malinda  
Shelmut remain in the hands of my beloved son  
John T. Benjamin & to be given off to her as her  
my judge best for her comfort and my will  
and desire is further that all the balance  
earned over

33 of my Estate of whatever it may amount shall be Equally divided amongst my beloved children as follows viz John T. Congino Esq Congino Abraham Congino James W. Congino and Malinda Shelcut & my Will is further that the part thereof which falls to my said beloved daughter Malinda Shelcut remain in the hands of my beloved son James W. Congino and that he pay it to her in such Articles as in his judgement she most needs at cash prices and at such times as in his judgement may contribute most to her comfort my Will is further that my beloved sister Holcomb have the sum of one Dollar of my Estate & no more and that my son in law Moses M. Smith have also the sum of one Dollar and no more my Will is further that my beloved son John T. Congino and James W. Congino be the Executors of this my last Will and Testament
