it respects myself and family that I should make
a disposition of the property with which a kind
providence has blessed me, I therefore make this
my last will and testament hereby revoking and
annulling all others heretofore made by me.

Item first: I desire and direct that my body be
buried in a decent and Christian like manner
suitable to my circumstances and Condition my soul
I trust shall return to God who gave it - as
hope for eternal salvation through the blessed Son
and Saviour Jesus Christ whose religion I
have professed and as I humbly trust have enjoyed
number of years.

Item second: I desire and direct that all my
just debts be paid without delay by my Executors
hereafter named as I am unwilling my creditors
should be delayed of their rights.

Item third: After the payment of all my just
debts as aforesaid I give and bequeath all my
property both real and personal to my children
(viz) Charles & Black Thomas J. Black Louisa
Beavers wife of Robert O Beavers Sarah Beavers
wife of Charles Beavers Amanda Gorman wife
of Wm H Gorman Matilda Roman widow of Armistead
Roman Jane Catharine McCluer wife of Wm B McCluer
and Elizabeth A Black Said property to be equally di-
vided between them, said division to be effected either
by the sale of said property and a distribution of the
proceeds of said sale, or in any other manner

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in which said legacies may agree among themselves
them forth. I constitute and appoint Robert
C. Brannen and William C. McBlair Executors of this
my last Will and Testament.
