gold watch to my sister Sarah Coryell; for
her many acts of kindness and attention to
-wards me and in case of her death to go to
my mother and two Sisters Anna and Elizabeth

I also give to my sister Sarah a Sufficient
- of (say Eighty Dollars) ~~to~~ out of my estate
to pay her Expenses to the North having pro-

- sent to her coming out. That I would in

Case of any accident, make provision for
her return. I also give to my sister Sarah
my Bed Bedding & Bedstead as long as she
remains in the County for her Especial use &
benefit & in case of her having to go to the
residence of my Estate.

It is my wish that she should leave in
Case of my death immediately for the North and
I authorize my Executor to advance out of my
money belonging to my Estate. the amount spe-
cified for that purpose, and in case she does
not wish to go - it is to be placed to the due of
my Estate.

I give and bequeath to my Cousin
- Eugenia Coryell, the Gold Watch now in
the possession of my sister Sarah, in case

and I authorize my Executor to hold it in trust
until she arrives at the age of 15 years —
I give and bequeath to my Executor Joseph
H. Coryell my Pistols and copy of Shakespeare
both having belonged to his brother — Junison
Coryell —

It is my wish that my horse and other
personal property should be disposed of
and the proceeds with the residue of my Estate
I give and bequeath to my dear Mother and
three Sisters — Ann — Sarah and Elizabeth
