of life and deeming it right and proper both
as respects myself and family that I should make a
disposition of my property with which a kind Providence
has blessed me, do therefore make this my
last Will and Testament.

Item the first. I desire and direct that all my just debts be
paid by my executors hereinafter appointed.
Item the second, I desire and direct that all my property
both real & personal be kept together for the benefit of
my Children. — And I desire that they all shall
be maintained out of it, and educated, and I
desire that my two sons shall receive a Collegiate
Education. ^{the sum of all which I desire}
to be paid out of my ^{whole} property so kept
together.

Item the third, I desire that when my eldest daughter
Sarah S. Beavers becomes of age or marries that
~~all~~ all my property shall be valued and that
she shall draw out an equal portion
which from thenceforth I desire to be her
part and interest in my property, and what
is left shall belong to the remaining children
which I desire shall also be continued and
kept together for their benefit and when my
next child shall become of age, I desire that
~~she~~ ^{he} shall have an equal portion with
the children interested therein shall
be drawn out, and become her. And
thus as each child becomes of age his or
her share shall be given out to it and

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the remainder be kept together for the benefit
of those under age, until they all have drawn
their shares; which I desire shall be exactly
equal.

Item the fourth: As I wish that all of my children
should be supported until of age & educated out
of my general estate; I desire that upon my child
becoming of age, and having their portion
set out to them, that it shall be taken into consid-
eration how much it will take to support
& educate them till under age and I wish
a proportionable deduction to be made from
his or her share, so that ~~as~~ each ~~may~~ ^{as possible}
each may have the same amount, after
all are educated & supported till maturity.

Item the fifth: All that ~~property~~ ^{property} which I have given
before ^{Campbell County Wills 1833 to 1862}
to them for ^{www.georgiapioneers.com} and during their natural lives
and at their death to go to and be vested in
their children ~~and~~ ^{respecting}.

Item the sixth I desire that when and so soon as each
of my daughters shall become of age or marry
and shall draw and her share of my property
which I desire she shall then do her property
which shall so be drawn and shall immediately
vest in Robert O. Beavers Decease B. Beavers
& Charles B. Beavers my brothers, as trustees
for her, whom I desire shall keep her
property and apply it to her use & benefit
for and during her natural life, and
at her death to deliver up the same to
her children. And I mean and desire
that ~~any~~ the said trustees may in their
discretion upon the marriage of either

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or each of my daughters deliver up
the possession of her property to her hus-
-band; subject however to her again
taking back should he be guilty of
Mismanagement or be idle to spend it.

And I desire also that should the property
of either of my daughters be by the trustees
given up to the possession of her husband
upon her marriage, that nevertheless upon
her death it shall descend and go to be sold
in her children. It being my intention
to give my daughters only a life estate.

Item the seventh: I desire that a suitable Tombstone
be by my executors erected over the grave of
my wife & children.

Item the eighth: I ~~do~~ hereby appoint Robert
O. Beavers, Benjamin C. Beavers and
Charles B. Beavers and Constable
their executors to this my last Will &
Testament this 11th of October 1852
