

Arnon Johnsons Will.

I, Arnon Johnson, of Said State of Georgia, } and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last Will and testament.

Item 1st. I will and desire to make an equal distribution of all my property among my children, and having already given to James C. Johnson and William A. Johnson a tract of land, to-wit: fractional lot No. 107, in the 4th district of Said County, and the same having been divided between them, except that portions of Said tract lying on the east side of Hooping Creek, and being desirous of making the remainder of my children equal with them.

Item 2nd. I will and bequeath to my daughter Sarah J. Tanner and her children, fifty acres of land more or less, situated in the South East corner of land lot No. 128, in the 4th district of Said County, the place on which she now resides, valued at three hundred dollars and at my death I will that her and her children receive out of the residue of my estate one hundred dollars to make her equal with James C. & William A. Johnson, as I consider the land I gave them worth four hundred dollars each.

Item 3rd. I will and bequeath to my daughter Martha Mary Ann Elizabeth Williamson and her children all that portion of land lot No. 104, in 4th district of Said County, lying on the east side of what is now known as the fine notch road, Hooping Creek being the line on the South end of Said tract, except about 14 acres in the South East corner of Said lot, the old road running north & South being the line of Said 14 acres and that portion given to my daughter Martha M.E. Williamson & her children, valued at four hundred dollars, where she now resides.

Item 4th. I will and bequeath to my daughter, Louisa M. Williamson and her children, Eighty acres of land, being a part of lot No. 105, on the North side of Said lot, commencing at the Chatahoochee River & running West, so as to cut off Eighty acres on the north side of Said lot valued at four hundred dollars.

Item 5th. I will and bequeath to daughter Nancy Williamson and her children, sixty five acres of land, being part of said lot No. 145, in the 4th district of said county lying south of the land given to my daughter Susan St. Williamson and her children, and running across said lot from the Chattahoochee River to the west line, the place on which the now resides, valued at four hundred dollars.

Item 6th. I will and bequeath to daughter Georgia Ann Amersbach and her children fifty acres of land, more or less to wit: all that portion of lot No. 145, in the 4th district, south of what is known as the line of the town of Mrs. Rebecca Berry also the 14 acres purchased on lot No. 144, valued at four hundred dollars.

Item 7th. I will and bequeath to daughter D. Johnson, my son, the four hundred dollars that he received from David Upchurch from the sale of that portion of lot No. 144, in the 4th district of said county, lying west of the five notch road, that being equal to the amount given to the balance of my children.

Item 8th. I will and devise the remainder of my land, to wit: sixty two acres more or less being fraction lot No. 146, in the 4th district of said county, being the place where I now reside, that at my death the same be sold by my executor hereafter appointed at public outcry, or at private sale, as he may think best for the interest of my estate, out of which sale I desire all my just debts be paid, after which I will and desire my grand daughter Jane W. Walker, to have one hundred dollars and all the remainder, including all my personal property, of which I may be possessed to be equally divided among all of my children, except the hundred dollars bequeathed to my daughter Sarah J. Tanner to make, her and her children equal with the balance.

Item 9th. I hereby appoint D. Constitute St. Tanner, J. C. Williamson and Benjamin Williamson my executors of this my last will and testament, this the 25th day of August A. D., 1886.
