 the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Savior  
 Jesus Christ.

2nd Item: I desire and direct that all my just debts be  
 paid without delay by my executors, herein after ap-  
 pointed.

3rd Item: I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Mary  
 C. Upshaw, all of the tract of land, whereon I now  
 live, containing one hundred and fifty acres, more  
 or less, with all the rights, members, and appur-  
 tenances to said tract of land in any wise belonging  
 to her own proper use benefit and behoof forever,  
 with full power to dispose of the same at any time  
 previous or by will or deed at her death as she may  
 think proper. I do also give and bequeath to  
 my beloved wife, in the same unreserved manner,  
 all my farming utensils, horses, mules, cattle, hogs,  
 sheep, wagges, wagons & household and kitchen fur-  
 niture belonging to and used on said plantation.

4th Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Beady  
 Jane Smith five dollars in money at par.

5th Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter  
 Holland S. Unquhart ten dollars in money  
 at par.

6th Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter  
 Curacy Ann Marchal ten dollars in money at  
 par.

7th Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter  
 Susan F. Darden five dollars in money at par.

8th Item: I will and desire that the remainder of  
 my estate be equally divided between my  
 beloved wife Mary C. Upshaw and my  
 three sons, John R. Upshaw, Joseph T. Upshaw  
 and Robinson V. Upshaw.

9th Item: I hereby constitute and appoint  
 my beloved wife Mary C. Upshaw executrix  
 and my worthy son J. R. Upshaw executor  
 of this my last will testament.
