disposing mind & memory do make and publish this my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following to w^t, I give and bequeath my soul to
God who gave it & I desire that my body be decently buried by my
friends.

Item 1st I hereby appoint my beloved wife Martha Bloodworth
& executrix of this my last Will and Testament & desire her as such Executive
to carry out faithfully every Item of this will.

Item 3^d I desire her to sell the land belonging to my estate, as also the following negroes by Jerry & Malinda Noah, Britton Franklin & Samuel as soon as early as practicable & at private or public sale as well as most convenient to the interests of my estate & if the above named property should insufficient to pay my debts and buy my wife a comfortable home I desire that she may sell a sufficient quantity of any other property belonging to my estate to enable her to settle my debts and procure her a comfortable home.

Item 4^a I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Martha Bloodworth the whole of my Estate both real and personal & except as before & hereinafter & as far as managed and controlled by her during her lifetime or widowhood & in the event of her marriage I desire that she shall have the use of two of the best negroes belonging to my estate at the time during her lifetime & at her death I desire the negroes sold and the proceeds equally divided between all my living children, or if any of them be dead to their legal representatives & in the event that my wife should die before settling the legal representation & in the event that the whole of my Estate should then be sold & that after making each of my children equal in point of property to those who have received a portion of my property, that the balance of my estate be equally divided between my son Wilson L. Bloodworth, Martha J. Bonner, Niram M. Bloodworth, Amanda M. Spur, Charles C. Bloodworth, Josephine M. Bloodworth & Ella M. Bloodworth.

Item 4^b Having given my son W. L. Bloodworth a negro boy by the name of Jim, my daughter Martha J. Bonner a negro girl by the name of Sarah and my daughter Amanda M. Spur a part of the price of a negro woman Negah & her child Margaret which I think makes three children about equal as to the amount I have given them. I desire that my Executrix Martha Bloodworth shall pay over to Niram Monroe Bloodworth an apple tree a negro of about the age & size as near as may be to the one given my son W. L. Bloodworth and as soon as my daughter Josephine M. Bloodworth & Ella Bloodworth shall come of full age or marry I desire my Executrix to give to each of them a negro girl or boy as near as may be of the age and size of the girl I gave to my daughter M. J. Bonner & I desire my Executrix as aforesaid to give to my son Charles C. Bloodworth when he comes of age a negro boy or girl of equal size & value with those given to my older children.

Item 5^a I desire again to repeat that is my desire that my wife as Executrix of my estate shall sell enough property of my estate to pay my debts & procure her a comfortable home wherover she desire to locate & after making provision for a brace of children equal to those to whom I have made advance to enjoy uninterrupted the remainder of my estate during her lifetime or widowhood and she is hereby fully authorized to buy and sell property of any kind she may think proper without being required to account for any profits arising from the same in any manner.

Item 6^a I desire that in the event of my wife's death or marriage before fully executing all the items contained in this will I desire and hereby appoint my son Wilson L. Bloodworth as an Executor to carry out the provisions of the same. In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my hand in presence of the undersigned witnesses & hereby acknowledge the foregoing manuscript of my will containing six items to be my last will and testament hereby revoking any and all wills heretofore made by me April 30th 1863.
