County 3 & Sarah Jane Bonner were present last Wednes-
-day March 6th 1861 at the residence of Thomas Bonner, son, of said County,
the place where Sanders W. Bonner unmarried man, had been taken & so
being from his own home and died before he returned to the place
of his own dwelling, about two hours & a half before his death in
perfect possession of his mental faculties as appeared to me said
Sanders W. Bonner called upon the bystanders and upon the undersig-
ed in particular to remember and take notice to what he was about
to say when he said he desired that his brother Thomas Bonner
should have the use of the money invested in the joint business
of himself and said Thomas and to pay off his debts out of it and
that Thomas keep and have the use of the balance until he got
in a condition to pay it back & that then that with all his
other property & effects should go into his Father's hands which
he gave to his Father Thomas Bonner son absolutely
that himself and his brother Thomas were in business together and
that it would embarrass the business if his money was taken out
of the concern at present. That his Father had given him the
property and that it was his Will and a desire that he should have
it back & his brothers & sisters would more than likely eventually get
it & inherit it from his Father March 8th 1861
