tament in doing of which, first I recommend my soul to God, who gave
it, hoping to receive eternal life through the merits of his son, Jesus Christ
my Redeemer.

1st: I will and desire, that my body be decently buried in a Christian
like manner.

2nd, In disposing of my Estate first of all I will and desire
that all my just debts be paid.

3rd: I will and desire that my beloved wife, Elender Bryce, have
own and possess all my estate, both real and personal, of every des-
cription, for and during her natural life, or so long as she may live,
for the purpose of her maintenance and comfort and the rais-
ing and educating the minor children, that is now living with
us namely; Felix S. C. Bryce, William H. Bryce, and Ira B. Bryce,
and that my wife Elender Bryce have power to give off to any of
said children married in this and item, such as horses, hogs, stock,
furniture, cattle or other things as she may have to spare from time
until they are made equal to the other and older children, that
has already married and left.

4th: I will and desire that my wife shall from time to time
as she may be able, give off the younger children such things as they
may need until they be made equal to the other children.

5th: I will and desire that should my wife die before my
youngest child or children should become of full age or
twenty one years old, or marry, the same shall remain
ungifted, for their maintenance and support until they arrive
of full age or marry and then all my estate both real and
personal be sold by my executor to the highest bidder, and the
proceeds be equally divided amongst all my children.
Provided that if any of children should fail to make equal to
the other children, that they shall first be made equal, and then
in equal division made.

6th: And lastly, I do make ordain and appoint my
legs sons John Hand, Felix S. C. Bryce, my sole and lawful executor
of this my last will and testament, hoping that will execute
the same with fidelity.
