Consisting of land Negroes horses Cattle hogs Sheep Corn fodder plantation tools household furniture and Also all the Kitchen furniture of which I give all mine and bequeath and behoof unto her my beloved wife during her life or widowhood and after her death I will give and bequeath an equal portion to all my dear beloved Children that they may make an equal division to each & everyone if this agreement can be made & if not for all or in ch part as cannot be divided to be sold according to Law and then the proceeds divided equally to my dear beloved Children whose names are as follows the eldest Son Timothy le Golden Nancy who is now the wife of J. P. Posey Jane the wife of Ruben Rice Sally the wife of McCraft Posey Betsey the wife of Mitchell Williamson Seaborn Wright - or Mcbuidy now the wife of Harrison Norton Hammett the wife of Thomas J. live to wit the lot or tract of land known by being lot No ninety
seven except a certain part which has been given to William
Golden on the east side of said Lot supposed to contain
Sixty Acres which part is now in possession of William
Golden The part now given and donated supposed to
contain one hundred and forty Acres more or less
and I Valeb Golden for and in Consideration of the
Love and Respect which I have for my Son Nathan
I Golden do give the above described tract or parcel of
land to have and to hold to himself and his heirs to
his own proper use benefit and behoof forever in fee
Simple from and after the death of his said mother Elizabeth
Golden But I reserve and now retain in myself the sole
right title claim and possession of the said premises for
and during my natural life together with the use
profits and benefits of of the said tract of land with all
its rents issues and profits of every kind But should my
said Loving wife Survive me then she is to have and receive

The said Papepian use and Profits of the Said tract of land during her natural life and then it is to revert to my said son Nathan I Goldin a fee Simple right title and possession of the said premises And I the said Caleb Goldin being now of sound mind and understanding do by these presents give and grant to the said Elizabeth Goldin during her natural life and then to my said son Nathan I Goldin the said tract in remainder after her, yet retaining to myself the possession use and occupation of the same during my own natural life I witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the thirteenth day of November in the year eighteen hundred and fifty Signed Sealed and delivered in Presence
