Carrico Leounta, In the name of God - I am, 21st
liam Diunooop of said County and State, being of
advanced age, but of sound and disposing mind and
memory, knowing that I must shortly depart
this life, deem it right and proper, both as respects
my family and myself, that I should make a dispo-
sition of the property with which a kind provi-
dence has blessed me, & do therefore make this my
last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others
by me heretofore made: First

I desire to yield up my soul into the hands of
who has, redeemed me, & further desire and di-
rect that my body be buried in a decent and Chris-
tian like manner, suitable to my circumstances
and condition in life. I desire to be buried in a
grave eight feet deep the vault to be made of brick
with an arch over the same, before which
I desire to be taken to the Church and the fol-
lowing services to be performed, and in order to wit:
To commence by singing the hymn, "Hear what the voice
from Heaven proclaims," Next read the 13th chapter
of First Epistle to the Corinthians, joining the pray-
ing to the close of said Chapter. Then prayer and
singing of hymn Communion "There is the land
of peace delight - &c. At the grave sing the do me,
mourner departing friends and their close by pray-
er, I desire that the Pastors of the Baptist and
Methodist Churches be invited to divide the
foregoing services. Outriven there, I further and
request that the readers of the Villa, Rea Church
be invited by the session of the Carrollton Church
to attend the services above mentioned. And I fur-
ther desire and request that the session of the Car-
rollton Church, invite the Rev. Henry Luigg, the first
convenient Sabbath, after the funeral to preach
to the people - In the morning, from the 5th verse
of the 1st psalm, and at night from the 13th vs.

verse of the 4th Chapter of the First Epistle to the Thessalonians, and that the clerk of the session in reading the invitation, specify the Text, & also desire that the session of the Villa Rica Church send a like invitation to the Rev. Donald Fraser asking him to preach at Villa Rica in the morning from the 5th & 6th & 5th verses of the 15th Chapter of First Corinthians, and at night from the 25th & 26th verses of the 11th Chapter of John.

Secondly! I give and bequeath to my son Thomas N. "Brown's Bible," "Scott's Commencement," and Jay's evening and morning Portion."

Thirdly! - I give to William R. my own Bible with the request, that he wear part with it, "Scott's Commencement," "Poor Man's Portion," "Macaulay's History of England," and "Doct. Hutton's History."

Fourthly! To Albert E. I give all my notes and sketches of sermons, "Homer on Psalms and Romans," "Chadwick's Concordance" and "Webster's Dictionary."

Fifthly! I give to Sarah Jane, "Hewitt's Bible" and the framed pictures & marks and jewels, all of the other books, I desire to retain with my wife until her death, then divided equally by the executor among the surviving children.

Sixthly! I give my watch, to my grand son William Charles Dickinson & Augusta his

move. I desire to give to my wife so long as she lives and at her death to my daughter Sarah Jane so long as she remains single, at her marriage or death said premises to be sold and the proceeds equally divided among the surviving children or their legal representatives.

Eighthly: I hereby constitute and appoint my son William C. Dimmock my sole executor of this my last will and Testament, giving him the power to sell and dispose of whatever of property, either publicly or privately, not necessary for the use of my wife, the proceeds to be applied to the payment of any debts against the estate, or any necessary repairs, I further give him the right and power by and with the consent of my wife and daughter, Sarah Jane, to sell or exchange the place on which I now live for any other place which in his judgment he may think needed be for their advantage, or otherwise, their rights and titles to the property bought or exchanged for, to be the same as herein before provided to the property sold or exchanged, I do further desire the directions heretofore mentioned in regard to my burial, to be carried out by my friend J. J. Juhan & Co. Georgia. The word Dimmock after William at end of first line of this will entered before signing.

Signed, sealed, declared and published by William Dimmock as his last will and Testament in the presence of us the undersigned who described our names hereto in the presence of said Testator at his special instance and request and in the presence of each other, this March 3th 1880, We witness also that the word Dimmock after the words I, William, in first line of this will was made before signing and witnessing.
