Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Duke
during her natural life or widowhood all my estate real & personal

Item 4th I give to my son George W. Duke at the death of my wife or
the end of her widowhood one half Share of my estate, and to my
grand daughter Sarah E. Duke one half Share of my estate, All the
rest of my Children or representatives to Share and Share alike
in all my Estate.

Item 5th I hereby constitute and appoint my two sons Alexander H.
& Zebulon P. Duke my Executors of this my last Will and Testament
hereby revoking all others made by me. Witnesseth my Hand & Seal the
20th day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand eight
hundred and Sixty six.
