State shall well and truly maintain & shall according
to his circumstances and shall take good and lawful care
of his person and property according to the laws of the
State and shall annually make a true and correct return
of all his acting and doing here in unto the said
Court officers the obligation to be paid else to remain in full
force in virtue whereof we have hereunto set our hands
