Carroll County<sup>3</sup> I Emanuel B. Martin of said State &  
County being infirm & knowing that I must shortly de-  
part this life, deem it right & proper both as respects my  
family & myself, that I should make a disposition of the  
property which a kind Providence has blessed me  
to therefore make this my last Will & Testament, here-  
by revoking all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I desire & direct that my body be buried in a  
decent & Christianlike manner, suitable to my profession.

Glen 2<sup>nd</sup> I desire & direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors or Executor hereinafter appointed

Glen 3<sup>rd</sup> I desire & direct my Executors or Executor to pay my son James Blanchard Seven hundred dollars as apart of his portion in & to my estate when he becomes of age. Also I give & bequeath to my daughter Sarah Elizabeth Griffin, wife of James E. Griffin & all her children free from the disposition liabilities & debts of her present or future husband, as a part of her & their portion in & to my estate, my servant negro girl Martha about twelve years of age - the said negro to be valued by good & impartial appraisers, selected by my Executors or Executor & in case she should not be valued at Seven hundred dollars, I desire & direct my Executors or Executor to pay her whatever amount the appraisal may fall short of the Seven hundred dollars, as a portion of my daughter's interest in my estate.

Glen 4<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath to my wife Ruth Anne Perry all the house hold & kitchen furniture, which she has or possessed in her own right, at & before our marriage or has been given to her since our marriage.

Glen 5<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath to my wife Ruth Anne Perry on condition that she marries again, one thousand dollars, and desire & direct my Executors then or within ten years after her marriage to pay her the said thousand dollars. Glen 6<sup>th</sup> I desire & direct all my minor children shall be clothed, supported & educated according to the customs of this country, in a manner suitable to my condition & circumstances in life.

Glen 7<sup>th</sup> I desire & direct that the place whereon I now live or any portion of it shall not be sold or divided out until my youngest child becomes of age & as soon, without delay as my youngest child becomes of age, my Executors or Executrix shall see to divide out this land, as well as the rest of my property among my children & wife Ruth Anne Perry, provided she does not marry again, equally, after first paying to my wife Ruth Anne Perry Seven hundred dollars in the event where she does not marry again, & the balance of my children the same amount, who have not received the seven hundred dollars, then the residue or balance of my property to be divided equally among all my children & wife Ruth Anne Perry, provided she does not marry again, in any manner my Executors or Executrix may think most equitable either by selling it & dividing the proceeds, or any portion of it, as my Executors or Executrix may think proper.

Glen 8<sup>th</sup> I desire & direct that my wife Ruth Anne Perry shall be supported & clothed during her widowhood, in the same manner & style as my minor children

Glen 9<sup>th</sup> I desire, direct & devise my Executors or Ex-

executors to sell, dispose of or convey, & make titles to any part portion of my estate except the lands retained in the 7<sup>th</sup> Clause, or so much thereof as may be necessary for all the purposes before named at any time, before the several amounts shall be paid, either at private or public sale which ever they think best.

Item 10<sup>th</sup> I desire & direct my Executors or Executrix to keep & repair or rebuild, cultivate lease or rent, or cause the same to be done, the place wherein I now live, which place contains about one thousand acres, for the purpose of educating & supporting my minor children, & supporting my wife Ruth Anna Perry during her widowhood, in any way or manner that they or she, may think will conduce most to the comfort & welfare of my family, & I desire & direct to keep & work on this or any other place, or hire out, or sell my negroes or any one of them, or more, for the same purpose or payment of any of the foregoing sums of money or for distribution, at private or public sale & make titles to the same.

Item 11<sup>th</sup> I desire & direct, that my Executors or Executrix, buy, sell or exchange any portion of my personal or real estate except the land named, in the 7<sup>th</sup> Clause, whenever they or she may think best.

Item 12<sup>th</sup> I hereby constitute & appoint my beloved wife Ruth Anna Perry, during her widowhood, my Executrix & my son James Blanchard Executor of this my last Will & Testament, & joint guardians of the person & property of my minor children, but in case my wife Ruth Anna Perry should marry again she then instantly ceases to be either the Executrix or Guardian of the persons or property of my minor children, but then my son James B. shall be the only the Executor/Guardian of the persons & property of my minor children, possessing full authority to execute & carry out my desires & directions specified in this my last Will & Testament, revoking their appointment to all intents & purposes, & thus I desire & direct the sum of one hundred dollars before named, & the Household & Kitchen furniture is all & every item, interest or claim that she, shall hold, possess or be entitled to, in any portion part, or the whole of my real or personal estate, be my remains or under any claim whatever.
