Knowing that I must shortly depart this life deem it right and proper
both do respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition
of the property which which a kind Providence has blessed me do
Therefore make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others
heretofore made by me

1st Item I desire and direct that my Body be buried in a decent and
Christianlike manner suitable to my Circumstances and Condition in life
My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it

2nd Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
3rd Item I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Mary lot of
Land 139 One hundred & thirty nine in the Sixth District of Carroll County containing
One hundred & fifty acres with all the rights incidents & appurtenances to said lot of
Land in anywise belonging during her natural life I Also give and bequeath
to my beloved wife in the same manner the farming utensils used on and
belonging to said plantation of every description whatever & Carriage & Harness
I Also give and bequeath to my beloved wife all of my house hold & kitchen
furniture.

4th Item I hereby constitute and appoint My sons William & Garrison
& John C. Garrison My Executors of this my last Will & Testament with the
Power to sell the Land known as the Pace place, provided they can get the
Purchase price with the Interest added. The balance of my land to
remain unsold until the death of my wife, then all to be sold and
an Equal division to be made with all of my Children with the Exception
of One hundred ¹⁰⁰ dollars to be deducted from A. W. M. Garrison part
This 23rd day of Feb 1880

W. Garrison sign the same as a witness in the presence of the Testator and at his request sworn to and subscribed before me
