this natural life I deem it right and proper that I should while
in life make some disposition of the property that I now own:
We therefore under this my last will and testament revoking
all the other wills heretofore made by me, I do hereby

Rev. S. J. P. I desire and direct that my body be buried in a
decent Christianlike manner suitable to my
groundsworn in life, my soul I trust shall return to
God who gave it.

And 2^d I desire and direct that my Executors shall pay
 off my just debts with all that I can.

March 1891 I have and direct that my beloved wife
Martha & Ephraim shall take charge of all I may
be possessed at my death, consisting of some dwelling
house and lot in the town of Willington, where I &
some negroes also (2) twelve acres of land near said
town, being part of lot of land No 1091. One hundred
and fifty three and the 1/2 District of said County
together with all my household & kitchen furniture
and to have the same to use as household & kitchen
possessions during her natural life. I wish to say
hereby give her the right to have said land &
lot and make deeds to the same if it should become
necessary for her support.

Upshaw, as witness thereto, it shall be, sold and conveyed
thence to the said heirs, hereinafter named, and to their heirs and assigns.
