Martin should she elect to keep the same and pay the debts out of the money she receives from the Insurance on my life in the Equitable Life Insurance Association of the United States, which I desire to be paid to her according to the terms named in the Policy as then may elect. Should she not elect to pay the debts out of said Insurance money, then it is my desire that sufficient of my said personal property be sold by my executor to pay my just debts as aforesaid.

Item 4<sup>th</sup>

I hereby appoint W. B. McLendon and Benj. H. Martin the executors of this my last will and Testament.
