George Cressell Cornell, I Hiram Sharp Jr
being more of sound mind and memory but failing
in health do make and constitute the following my last
will and testament to wit.

Item 1st After the death of myself and my wife Sarah
I give and bequeath all of my personal effects to be
equally divided amongst all my children living and dead
the shares of those dead to be and go to those children living
at my death or having legal descendants
Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my son George S Sharp
one 3rd of the land on lot No 209 in the 5th district lying East
of the Road leading from Carrollton to Von Spens - that is
the north 3rd of said parcel of land as run off by me and
divided from the part dedicated by me to Sarah Houston
Children by a marked line running East and West
from said Road to the East line of said lot -

Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my son Hiram Sharp Jr
the 3rd of the same parcel of land on the same lot lying
East of said Road - that is the south 3rd of said
parcel of land as run off by me & divided from the 3rd
dedicated to Houston Children by a marked line running
from said Road to the East line of said parcel of land

So that the said H Sharp Jr Shall hold the south 3d of
the said parcel of land lying East of the Connelton & Van Wert
Road; the said George Sharp hold the north 3d of the same
the middle 3d of the same having already been disposed of by
Sarah Howards Children.

Given 4th I Constable & affix my beloved sons George S.
Sharp & Hiram Sharp Jr my Executors
