I give and bequeath to my daughter, Sophronia Miller, one cow
and calf, and one horse.

Item 3rd

I give and bequeath to my beloved son John C. Sharp, bid-
ded bed and bedding that was his mother's

Item 4th

I give and bequeath after my death being a single, the remain-
der of my real and personal property to my beloved wife
Oratella J. Sharp and my children Frank J. Sharp, Essa-
becca V. Sharp, Frederick Sharp, Henry S. Sharp, Rhoda S.
Sharp and Fannie Sharp and for my wife only to con-
trol and contribute distribute to the more named chil-
dren as she thinks best, but to be disposed of or controlled
in no other way whatever.

Item 5th

I also declare that there be no appraisement of my estate
and that there be as little cost as possible in carrying
out my designs into effect as above written. I also direct
my wife to be probated in simple form
Item 6th — I hereby appoint my son J. T. Sharp exec-
tor of this my last will and testament
