My property Consisting of forty Acres of land more or less lying and being in the South east Corner of lot No 225 in the Eleventh District of Carroll County Also notes to the amount of three hundred dollars more or less Also Stock Consisting of one horse Cows and hogs amounting to one hundred dollars or more Also house hold and kitchen furniture Also one Carriage & Harness. Further bequeit connectively for my wife J. J. Holaway to support and raise her Children so long as she remains a widow but provided that she Should marry I Will that all said property with its increase be equally divided between my Children for their Individual bequeit in witness I place my hand and Seal day & date above written
