 Third - my Stock of all kinds & house hold and Kitchen furniture  
 to be sold and equally divided as my land and negroes aforesaid  
 all of which I do make and beg witness without any persuasion  
 or Compulsion on the part of any one whatever This second day  
 of August Eighteen hundred and fifty nine.
