 Carroll County) Poley & Thomas Banner John Long & William W. Benson Executors
 are held and firmly bound unto their Heirs the Justices of the Superior Court sitting
 for ordinary purposes for said County and their successors in office and assigns in
 the Just and full sum of Four thousand dollars for the payment of which sum
 to the said Court of Judges and their successors in office we bind ourselves our
 heirs Executors and administrators in the whole and for the whole sum jointly and
 severally and firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 21st
 day of January 1846. The condition of the above obligation is such that if the
 above bound Pinckney & Poley and Elizabeth Poley administrators & administration
 of the Goods Chattels and credits of Daniel Poley late of Carroll County deceased
 which have or shall come into the hands possession or knowledge of the said
 administrators or the hands or possession of any person or persons for them and
 the same to make do exhibit unto the said Court of Ordinary when they shall
 be thereunto required and such Goods Chattels and Credits do well and truly
 administer according to law and do make a just and true account of their act
 ings and doings therein when they shall thereunto be required by the Court
 shall deliver and pay to such person or persons respectively as they may be entitled
 to the same by law. And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and
 Testament was made by the deceased and the same be proven before the Court of
